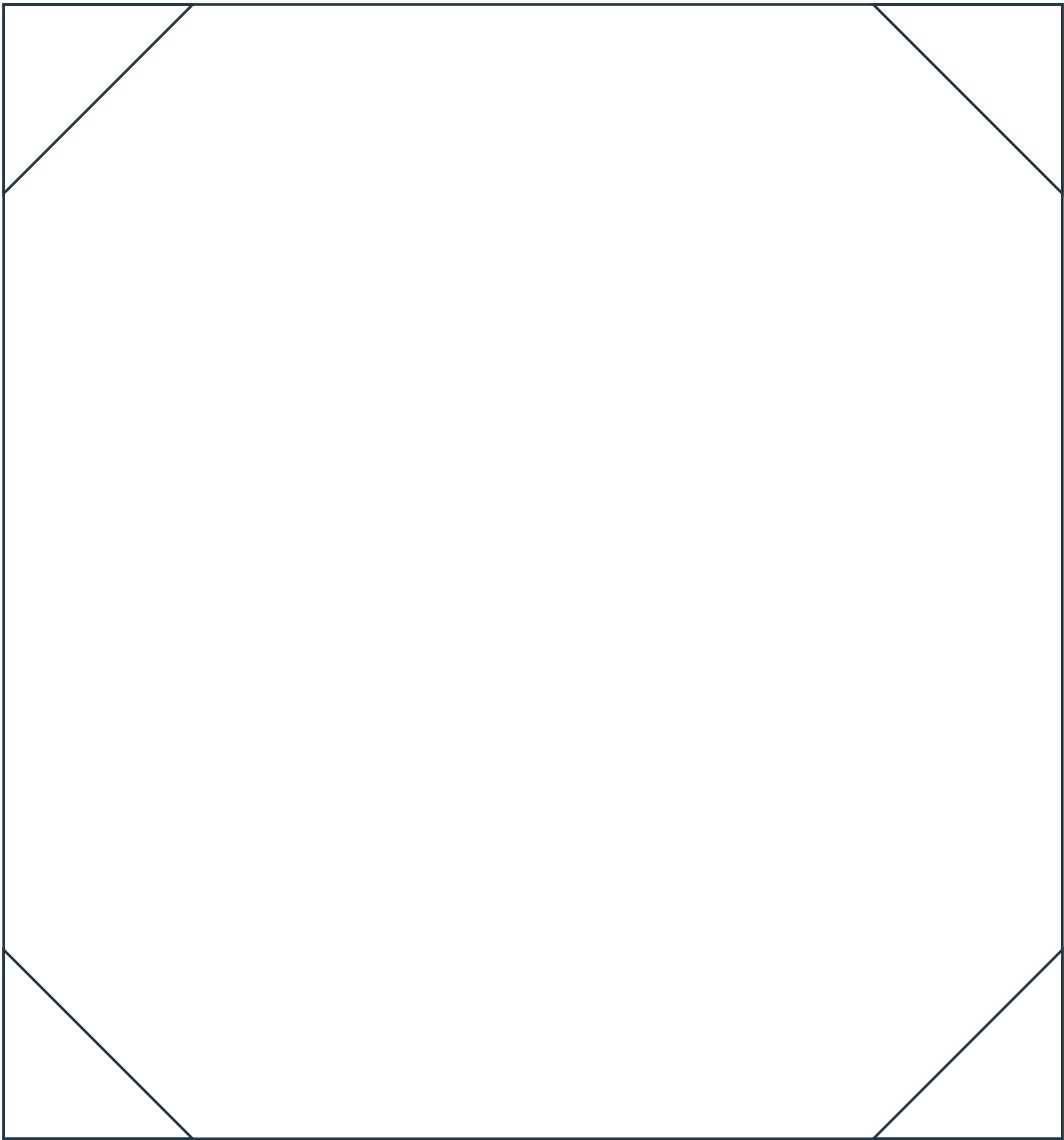


Flat artwork corner pockets



Flat artwork corner pockets

Assembly and use / Print at actual size / Make a plain-paper trial

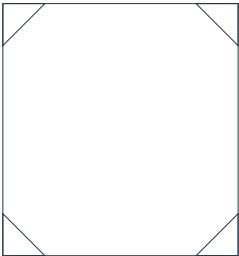
MAKE THE PROJECT

Use four triangular paper corner pockets on a separate backing to hold flat artwork.

YOU WILL NEED

Matching printed sheet; ruler; pencil; scissors. Additional materials are identified in the steps.

50 mm scale check | Measure after printing
Print at actual size. Use for making a trial run.

TEMPLATE REFERENCE

- 01 Print at 100% and check the 50 mm reference. Cut the large outer rectangle, then cut its four diagonal corner lines to release four triangles.
- 02 Choose a separate backing larger than the artwork. Place the artwork temporarily and mark its four corner positions lightly.
- 03 For each triangle, apply a narrow adhesive line along only the two short outer edges. Leave the long diagonal edge unglued.
- 04 Attach the triangles at the marked corners of the backing. Let them dry completely before sliding the artwork corners under the open diagonals.
- 05 Check that the artwork sits flat and can be removed without bending. Do not apply glue directly to the artwork.

Backing is not supplied. Make a scrap-paper trial; archival suitability depends on materials and has not been established.
