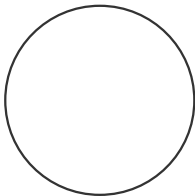
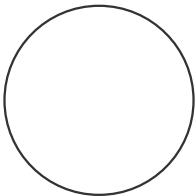
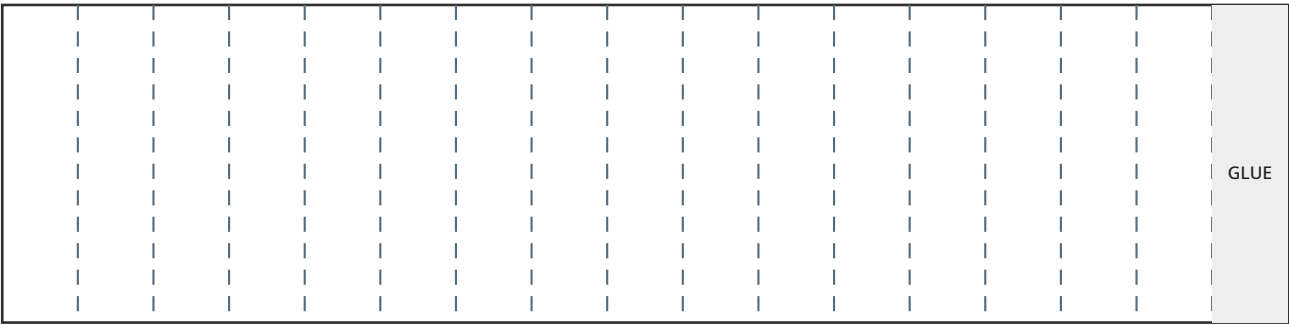
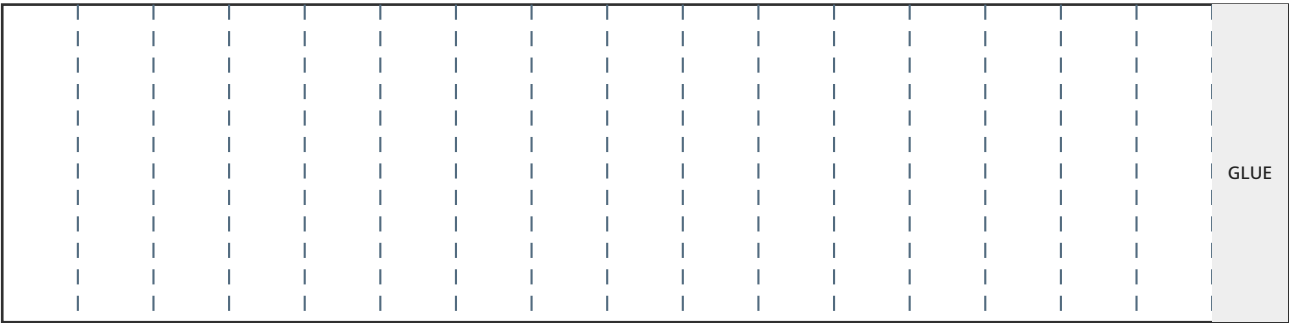
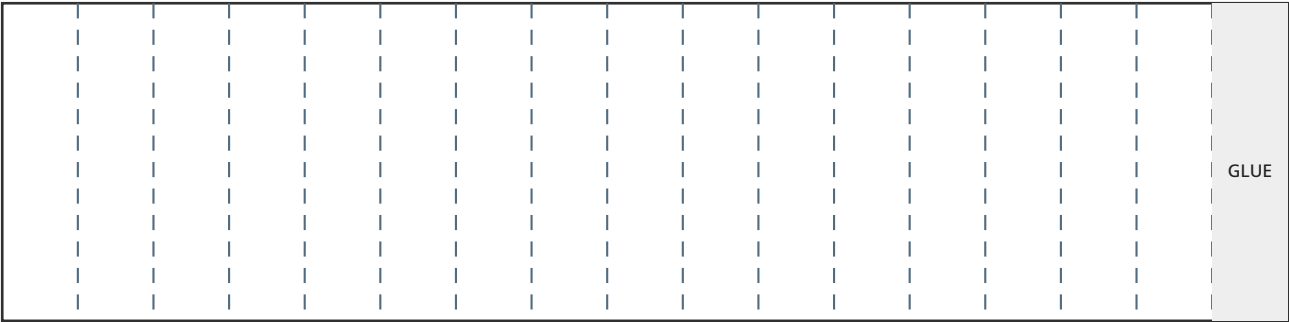


Accordion paper rosette

Three pleated strips and two backing circles



Accordion paper rosette

Assembly / solid = cut / dashed = fold

MAKE THE PROJECT

A three-strip accordion rosette with 48 pleat panels and two 25 mm center disks.

YOU WILL NEED

Paper, scissors, ruler, blunt scoring tool and adhesive.

- 01 Cut the three strips and two circles. Each strip has sixteen 10 mm pleat panels plus one 10 mm glue tab.
- 02 Score and accordion-fold each strip, alternating the fold direction at every guide. Keep all working folds the same width.
- 03 Join the strips end to end by overlapping each shaded tab under a neighboring full panel. Close the third join to make a pleated ring.
- 04 Stand the ring on an edge, then gently flatten it into a radial fan. Bring the inner edges together without tearing the pleats.
- 05 Glue one circle beneath the center and one over the center. Hold flat until set. The 42 mm strip depth suggests an approximately 84 mm rosette before material effects.

Try the pattern on ordinary paper first. Paper thickness, folds and joins affect the result. The digital layout is checked; physical assembly and durability remain untested.
