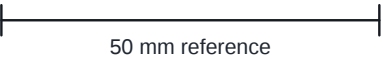
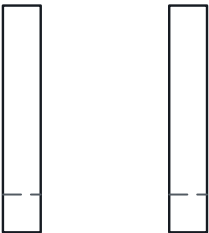
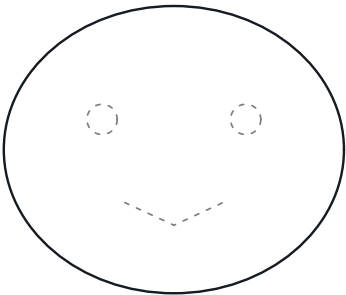
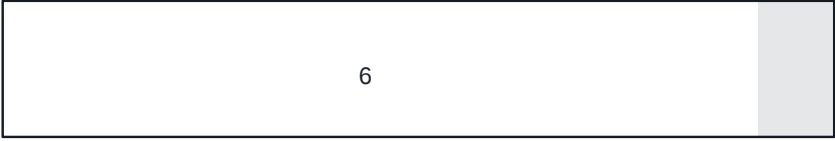
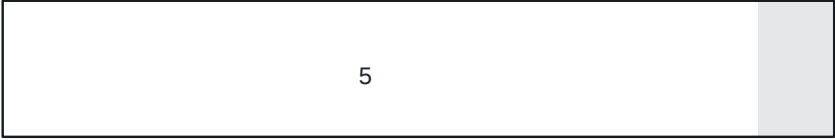


Paper caterpillar chain

Print the matching paper size at 100% / actual size.
Measure this line before cutting, folding or tracing.

Paper caterpillar chain

pap-143 / LETTER / INSTRUCTIONS / 2 of 2

Six interlocking paper body loops, a flat head and short paper antennae for a tabletop character.

DIMENSIONS

Six body strips: 110 x 18 mm; each includes a 10 mm joining zone.

Head: 45 x 38 mm.

Two antenna strips: 30 x 5 mm.

MAKE A PLAIN-PAPER TRIAL

- 01 Cut six body strips, the head and the two short antenna strips.
- 02 Join the first body strip into a loop using its 10 mm marked overlap.
- 03 Thread the next strip through the first loop before joining it. Repeat until all six loops form a chain.
- 04 Fold the lower ends of the antenna strips behind the head and attach them with small paper tabs.
- 05 Attach the head to the first loop. Display the finished chain on a table rather than wearing or hanging it.

MATERIALS

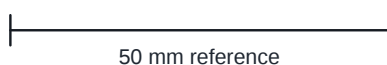
Ordinary paper for a first trial; scissors; ruler; a blunt scoring tool; a small amount of paper adhesive.

BEFORE YOU USE IT

Contains small paper pieces; not a toy safety specification.

No neck loop or wearable attachment is included.

Solid boundary = cut. Long dashes = fold/score. Dots = positioning guide. Pale grey = joining area. Keep tabs attached. Adult help is needed for internal cuts.



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
