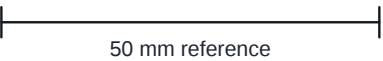


Interlocking napkin ring pattern

Print the matching paper size at 100% / actual size.
Measure this line before cutting, folding or tracing.

Interlocking napkin ring pattern

Three slit-lock bands that interlock without adhesive around a trial folded napkin.

DIMENSIONS

Three strips: 180 x 25 mm.

Opposed slots: 15 mm from each end, 13 mm deep.

Nominal slot-to-slot length: 150 mm.

MAKE A PLAIN-PAPER TRIAL

- 01 Cut the strips, then cut each short solid slot to its stop mark.
- 02 Curl a strip around a dry trial napkin. Do not fold or crease the whole band.
- 03 Bring the two ends together with the slots facing opposite edges.
- 04 Slide one slot through the other gently until the two strip edges align. Do not enlarge the slots by tearing.
- 05 Check that the ring can be removed without damaging the napkin or stressing the slot ends.

MATERIALS

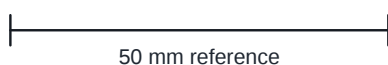
Ordinary paper for a first trial; scissors; ruler; a blunt scoring tool; a small amount of paper adhesive.

BEFORE YOU USE IT

Decorative outer napkin wrap; not a food-contact material approval.

Fit depends on the actual napkin and stock thickness.

Solid boundary = cut. Long dashes = fold/score. Dots = positioning guide. Pale grey = joining area. Keep tabs attached. Adult help is needed for internal cuts.
