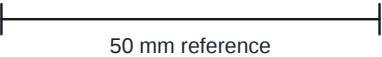
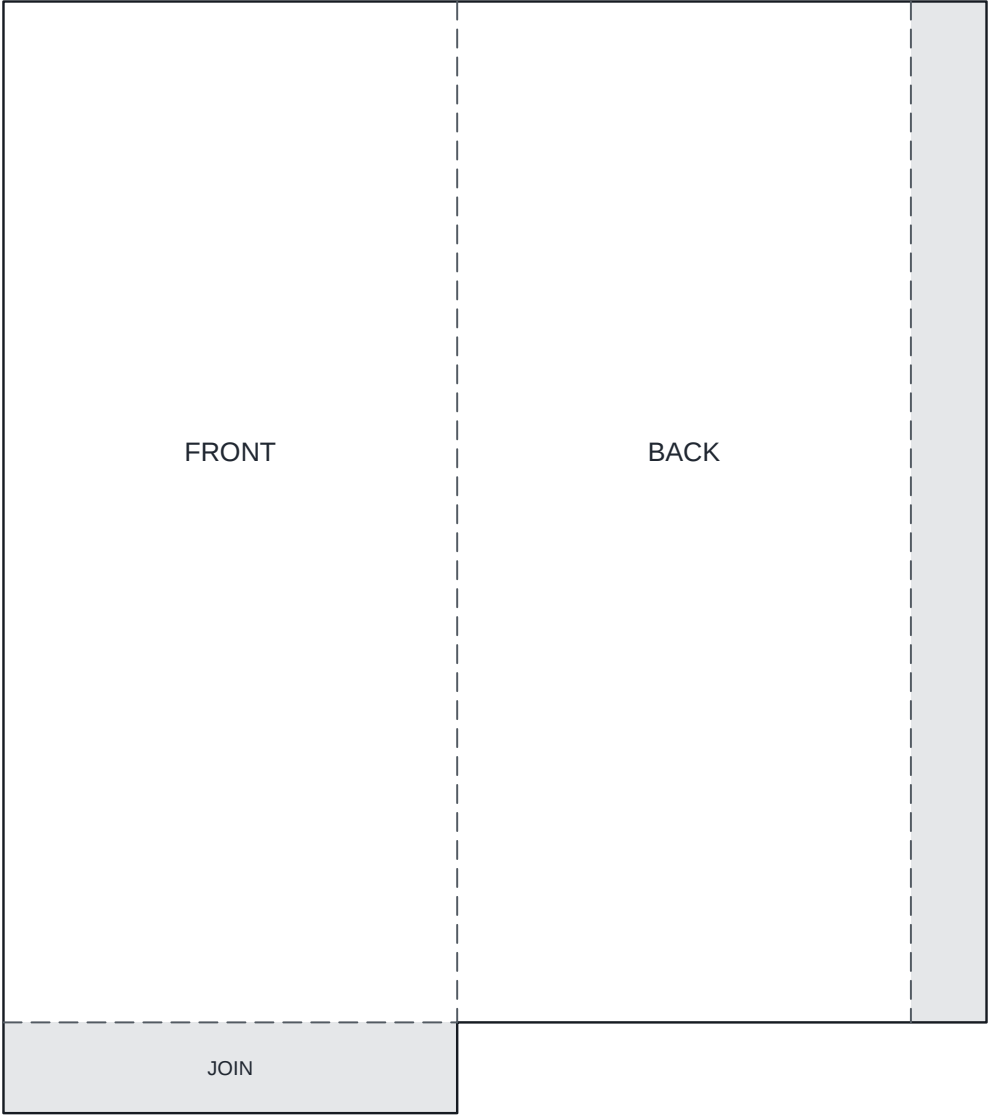


# Paper cutlery sleeve pattern

# Paper cutlery sleeve pattern

par-077 / A4 / INSTRUCTIONS / 2 of 2

---

An open-top flat sleeve for presenting napkin-wrapped table cutlery, with a closed lower seam.

## DIMENSIONS

Main panels: 60 x 135 mm.

Side seam: 10 mm; lower joining flap: 12 mm.

No gusset or reinforced base is included.

## MAKE A PLAIN-PAPER TRIAL

- 01 Cut the outer net, retaining the side and lower joining flaps.
- 02 Score the middle, side seam and lower flap folds.
- 03 Fold the second panel behind the first and join the side seam. Leave the top edge open.
- 04 Fold the lower flap across the back and let the adhesive set fully.
- 05 Test a wrapped, clean trial setting. Keep paper and adhesive away from food and from the eating surfaces.

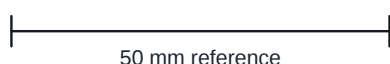
## MATERIALS

Ordinary paper for a first trial; scissors; ruler; a blunt scoring tool; a small amount of paper adhesive.

## BEFORE YOU USE IT

Table presentation only; no food-contact, carrying-load or reusable-sleeve certification.

Solid boundary = cut. Long dashes = fold/score. Dots = positioning guide. Pale grey = joining area. Keep tabs attached. Adult help is needed for internal cuts.
