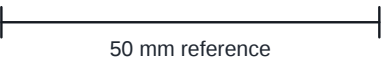
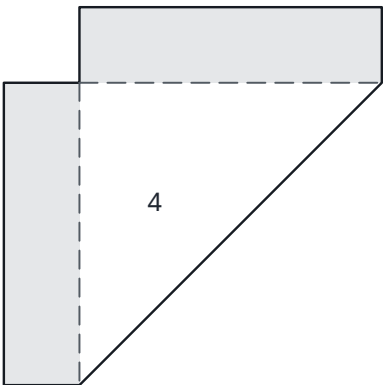
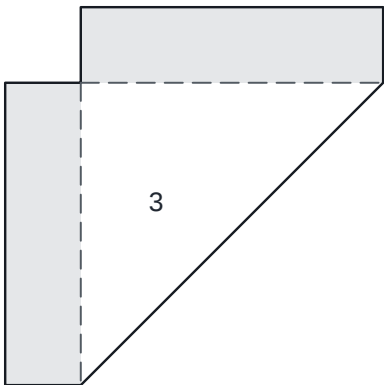
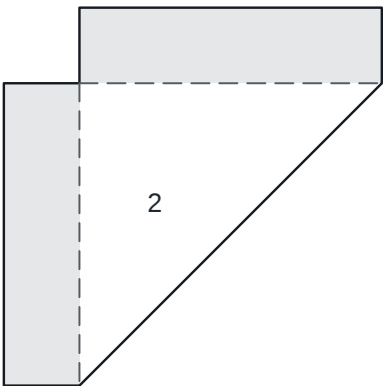
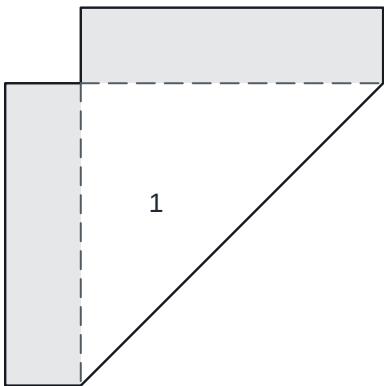


Paper placemat corner pockets

Print the matching paper size at 100% / actual size.
Measure this line before cutting, folding or tracing.

Paper placemat corner pockets

par-078 / LETTER / INSTRUCTIONS / 2 of 2

Four triangular corner pockets with return flaps for attaching a paper insert to a paper placemat or backing.

DIMENSIONS

Four triangular faces: 40 mm legs.

Return flaps: 10 mm.

Pocket opening is the diagonal edge.

MAKE A PLAIN-PAPER TRIAL

- 01 Cut four complete pocket outlines and keep their return flaps.
- 02 Score the two straight face edges, not the diagonal opening.
- 03 Fold the returns behind each triangular face. Position all four pockets using a scrap-paper insert as a spacing guide.
- 04 Glue the folded returns to the backing sheet only. Keep the face and diagonal opening free of adhesive.
- 05 Let the joins set, then remove and reinsert the paper sample to verify that every opening stays clear.

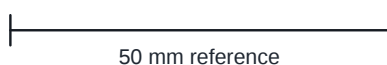
MATERIALS

Ordinary paper for a first trial; scissors; ruler; a blunt scoring tool; a small amount of paper adhesive.

BEFORE YOU USE IT

Paper display attachment only; not spill-resistant or a food-contact barrier.

Solid boundary = cut. Long dashes = fold/score. Dots = positioning guide. Pale grey = joining area. Keep tabs attached. Adult help is needed for internal cuts.



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
