This packet gathers the resources listed below. Use the individual pages as needed; included planning sheets do not replace specialist instructions.

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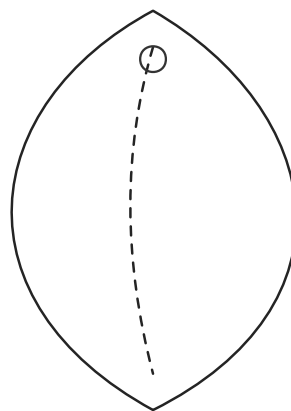
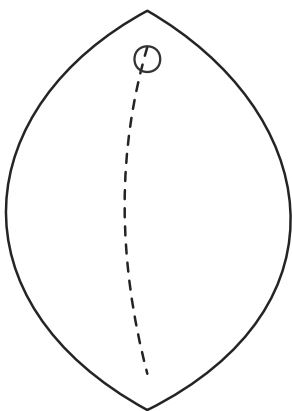
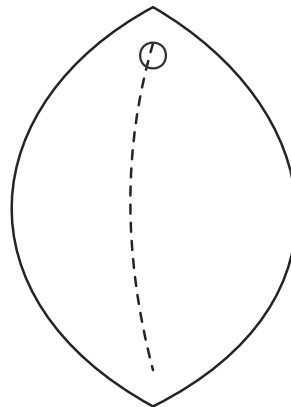
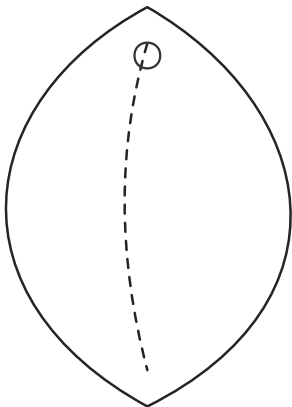
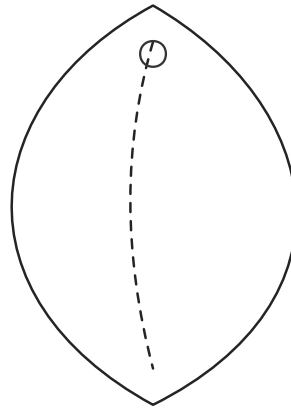
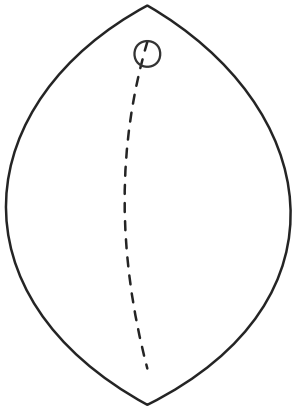
PRINT AND USE

Select the same paper size throughout the packet. Use actual-size printing for cutouts or grids. Check each resource's own reference marker where supplied: lengths can differ.

For cutting or assembly, make one trial first. Keep instructions and answer pages with their matching resource. These components are reused intentionally; the pack is a convenience collection.

Leaf hanging shapes for a garland or mobile

Solid = cut / Dashed = fold or guide / Test one before making a batch

Leaf hanging shapes for a garland or mobile

Use guide / Choose a garland or hanging mobile arrangement

MAKE A GARLAND

Cut around the outside of each leaf; the interior line is decorative, not an extra slit.

Punch the marked attachment point only after checking that enough paper remains around it.

Thread the leaves onto one cord, spacing them before fixing them with small knots or paper-safe tape.

MAKE A HANGING ARRANGEMENT

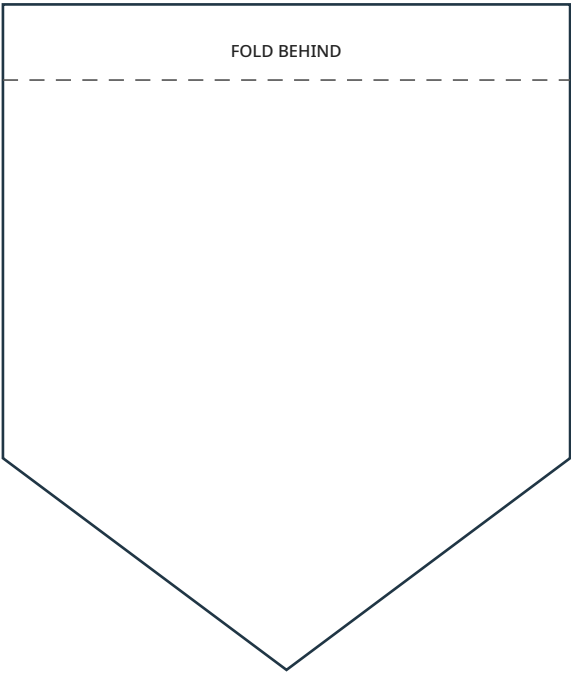
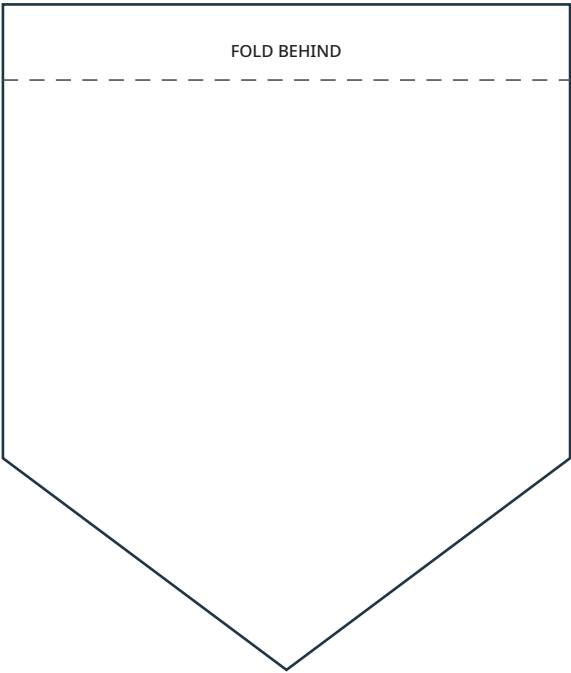
Use your own lightweight horizontal support; the template supplies leaf shapes, not a support frame.

Attach leaves on separate short lengths of thread. Add one at a time and adjust the positions until the support hangs level.

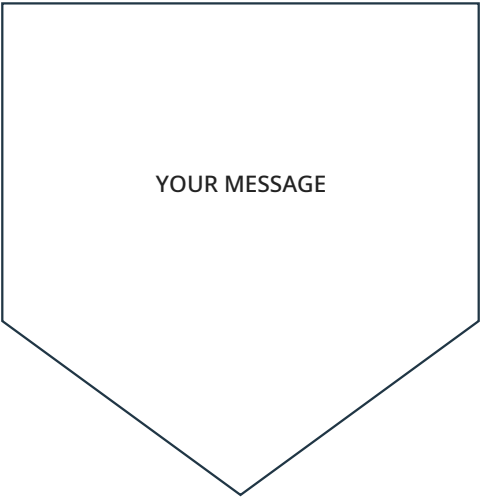
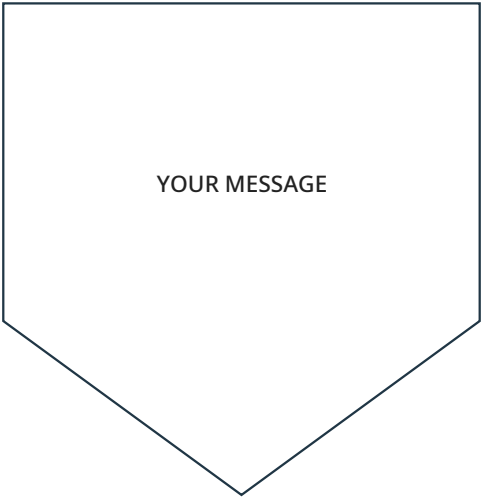
Keep hanging cords away from children and never install above a cot or sleeping area. Trial the paper and attachment before display.

Layered pennant bunting

Sheet 1 / Two outer flags and two inset layers / Solid = cut; dashed = fold

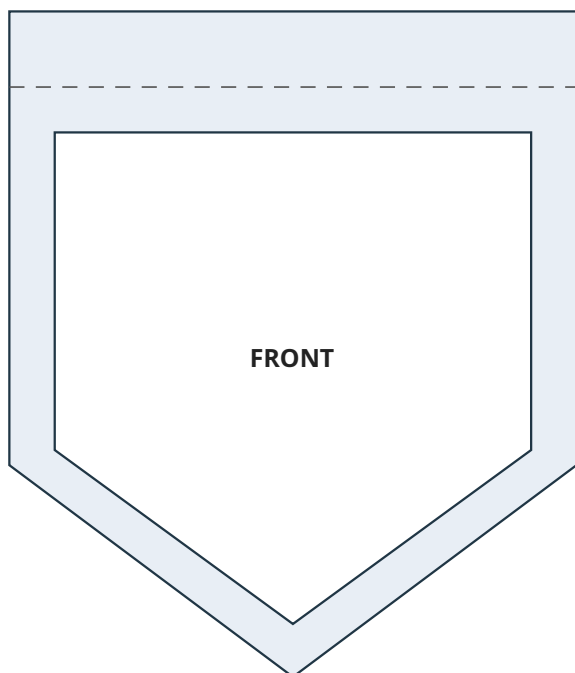


INSET LAYERS / use a second color if desired



Layered pennant bunting

Sheet 2 / Alignment, joining and hanging sequence



The inner layer sits 6 mm from each side and 6 mm below the flap fold. Its point stays 7 mm above the outer point.

Only the top 10 mm flap folds. The smaller front layer is flat.

1. Print at actual size and check the 50 mm line. Cut the four outer silhouettes on page 1.
2. Add a message to each inner layer. Position it as shown, leaving the hanging flap clear.
3. Glue the inner layer to the front using a thin, even paper adhesive. Allow it to dry flat.
4. Score the dashed top line and fold the flap backward over string. Secure the flap to the back, not across the visible front.
5. Make one trial flag before preparing a long run. Hang out of reach of young children; this is a paper decoration, not a toy.
